Essential Venue Guide

The Shooting competition will take place on the well-established Full Bore range and temporary new Shotgun, Pistol and Small Bore ranges at Barry Buddon Shooting Centre, located near Carnoustie on Scotland's dramatic east coast.

At Barry Buddon Shooting Centre

For everyone's safety and enjoyment of the event, all spectators will pass through an airport style screening process for prohibited and restricted items before being allowed into venues.

<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Spectator Information Point on the Spectator Plaza, including induction hearing loop and Lost & Found service for people and property.- Wheelchair loan.- Pushchair and wheelchair storage.- Accessible toilets and baby changing (NB no Changing Places toilet available).- First Aid.- Merchandise, food & drink kiosks and free water filling stations.- There will be no cloakroom facility. However, Shooting is an outdoor event, with grass surfaces in places and limited shelter from sun and rain, so check the local weather forecast and dress appropriately.- Cash only payments will be accepted by food & drink kiosks and programme sellers. (NB no ATM/cashback facility available). Merchandise kiosks accept cash, VISA and MasterCard.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Please note there has been a change to the Gate Opening times. Gates will open 1 hour before the first competition session start time each day.- Plan your journey now. Make sure you know how to reach the venue, and allow plenty of time for travel and security checks.- Your valid day ticket for Barry Buddon Shooting Centre allows you access to all sessions and medal ceremonies taking place that day.- There are significant walking distances to the venue from the Black Slab parking area and shuttle drop-off point, and between the ranges. An accessible buggy is available to transport spectators with limited mobility between ranges.- The Full Bore range will be standing only. All other ranges will provide a mix of unreserved seating on a first-come, first-served basis (including accessible seating) and standing areas. There is a partially covered seating area in which you can take a break.- It is not possible to leave Barry Buddon Shooting Centre then re-enter – make sure you bring everything you need.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Mobile phones must be silent during competition, and flash photography is not permitted.- Assistance dogs are permitted, but pets may not be brought inside the venue.- Cycles and other wheeled vehicles (with the exception of mobility aids) may not be brought inside the venue.- Bringing a bag may slow down your entry. Each spectator is permitted one small bag no larger than 20 litres (equivalent to 30 x 20 x 20 cm/12" x 8" x 8"). It must be soft sided and fit under your seat.- Smoking, including electronic cigarettes, is not permitted within any Games venue. This includes any open air space within the venue perimeter. Smoking is discouraged immediately outside venues.- Children under the age of two years on 23 July 2014 will not require a ticket. Children under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult and may not enter the venue alone.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Alcohol can be purchased from the food & drink kiosks, but may not be brought into the venue from outside.- All containers of liquids, aerosols or gels – except sunscreen (200ml) and non-alcoholic drinks (500ml) – must be 100ml or under in volume.- You can bring a plastic water bottle of 500ml or under.- The following items will not be permitted at Barry Buddon Shooting Centre: cans; glass; horns, vuvuzelas or similar items; flags of non-participating causes, affiliations or organisations; all photographic equipment over 30cm in length, including tripods and monopods; golf style umbrellas, large bags, coolbags and picnic hampers.- The following items are prohibited and illegal under Scottish law: knives; firearms; ammunition; explosives; toxic or irritant chemicals; CS spray; illegal drugs and similar substances.- For full details and guidelines, visit: glasgow2014.com/tickets

On the day for which it is valid, your event ticket will entitle you to use selected train and bus services in the local area. Further details are available at glasgow2014.com/transport/public-transport



- Limited parking for wheelchair users/Blue Badge holders is available at the Black Slab parking area by Carnoustie Golf Hotel, and includes Accessible Shuttle transport to the venue entry. It's free and must be pre-booked on a first-come, first-served basis at glasgow2014.com/accessibility
- An Accessible Shuttle service for those with restricted mobility is available from Carnoustie Station, as detailed on the following page, and must also be pre-booked at glasgow2014.com/accessibility
- Passengers alighting at Carnoustie Station should contact ScotRail's Assisted Travel Helpline on 0800 912 2 901 regarding any specific accessibility needs: the station has no step free access.






Near Barry Buddon Shooting Centre

- **Angus Glens**
Take in the beautiful countryside and wildlife at the Angus Glens. Each of these five interlinked glens has its own character and is ideal for family rambles or serious hikes. Or why not explore the area by bike?
- **Arbroath Abbey**
The abbey was founded in the 12th century by King William and is the site where the Declaration of Arbroath was signed by Scottish nobles in 1320, when they swore their independence from England. Step back in time on a visit to this Scottish treasure.
- **Glamis Castle**
The childhood home of HM Queen Elizabeth, The Queen Mother is a must-see. Daily tours through the castle and gardens will inspire you as you swot up on 600 years of aristocratic history.
- **Caledonian Railway**
Take a trip on the classic steam locomotive of the Caledonian Railway running every weekend from May between picturesque Victorian Brechin Station and the Bridge of Dun.
- **Carnoustie**
Carnoustie is located directly alongside Barry Buddon, with magnificent golf courses and a busy town centre. It's had a long and illustrious association with The Golf Open Championship since 1931 and has hosted seven Opens.
- **Discovery Point (Dundee)**
Experience life with Captain Scott and his crew on the RRS Discovery. This is the ship which was home to the famous explorer and his crew while trapped in crushing ice for two years in the Antarctic.
