



SCOTTISH EXHIBITION + CONFERENCE CENTRE (SECC) PRECINCT

Essential Venue Guide

The SECC is one of Scotland's most visited venues, hosting a variety of concerts, events and conferences. At Games Time, its large-scale Halls will host Judo, Wrestling, Boxing and Netball. Artistic and Rhythmic Gymnastics and the Boxing and Netball Finals will take place inside the futuristic Hydro – the riverside's newest landmark – and Weightlifting and Para-Sport Powerlifting will be contested in the iconic Clyde Auditorium.



At the SECC Precinct

For everyone's safety and enjoyment of the event, all spectators will pass through an airport style screening process for prohibited and restricted items before being allowed into venues.

After security screening and ticket check, you will arrive on the main Spectator Plaza. From here, you will make your way to the competition venue for your session.

Merchandise kiosks accept cash, VISA and MasterCard. | <ul style="list-style-type: none">– Plan your journey now. Make sure you know how to reach the SECC Precinct and allow plenty of time for travel, queuing systems at transport hubs, and security checks.– Do not drive to the venue. Except limited pre-bookable facilities for Blue Badge holders, there will be no parking or set-down/pick-up points for private cars at or near the venue.– Aim to arrive at the precinct between 60 and 90 minutes before your session start time. If you arrive earlier, your ticket won't be valid for entry. Make sure you allow plenty of time for security and ticket checks.– There will be no access from the existing covered walkway joining Exhibition Centre Station and the SECC Precinct.– If you're attending an event within one of the SECC Halls, check your ticket to ensure that you're entering by the right doors.– You may have to queue outside the venue for some sessions – please follow instructions from staff.– Public transport is expected to be particularly busy after each session so walking or cycling may be your easiest way of returning to the city centre. | <ul style="list-style-type: none">– No flash photography is permitted inside any SECC Precinct venue.– Bringing a bag may slow down your entry. Each spectator is permitted one small bag no larger than 25 litres (equivalent to 30 x 20 x 20 cm/12" x 8" x 8"). It must be soft sided and fit under your seat.– Children under the age of two years on 23 July 2014 will not require a ticket for any SECC Precinct venue, and will not be allocated a seat. Children under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult and may not enter the Precinct alone.– Smoking, including electronic cigarettes, is not permitted within any Games venue. This includes any open air space within the venue perimeter. Smoking is discouraged immediately outside venues. | <ul style="list-style-type: none">– Alcohol can be purchased from the food & drink kiosks, but may not be brought into the venue from outside.– All containers of liquids, aerosols or gels – except sunscreen (200ml) and non-alcoholic drinks (500ml) – must be 100ml or under in volume.– You can bring a plastic water bottle of 500ml or under.– The following items will not be permitted at the SECC Precinct: cans; glass; horns, vuvuzelas or similar items; flags of non-participating causes, affiliations or organisations; all photographic equipment over 30cm in length, including tripods and monopods; golf style umbrellas, large bags, coolbags and picnic hampers.– The following items are prohibited and illegal under Scottish law: knives; firearms; ammunition; explosives; toxic or irritant chemicals; CS spray; illegal drugs and similar substances.– For full details and guidelines, visit: glasgow2014.com/tickets |

At the competition venues

Clyde Auditorium (Weightlifting. Para-Sport Powerlifting.)

- On arrival, please follow directions to ensure you reach the seating area that corresponds to the **entry level** on your ticket.
- Prams and pushchairs must be admitted to the **dedicated ground floor storage area** before you enter the seating area.
- It is not possible to exit the Clyde Auditorium back onto the Plaza, then re-enter the Auditorium. Merchandise, food & drink kiosks and toilets are available within the venue.

SSE Hydro (Gymnastics. Boxing Finals. Netball medal matches.)

- On arrival, please follow directions to ensure you reach the seating area that corresponds to the **block letter** on your ticket.
- Prams and pushchairs must be admitted to one of the two **dedicated ground floor storage areas to the left and right of the entrance**, before you enter the seating area.
- The **ground floor Information Point inside the main door** includes a Lost & Found service for people and property; a wheelchair loan service; and an induction hearing loop service.
- It is not possible to exit the SSE Hydro back onto the Plaza, then re-enter the Hydro. Merchandise, food & drink kiosks and toilets are available within the venue.

SECC Netball Hall

- The Netball Hall can be accessed via doors 1 and 3 on the right-hand side of the concourse.
- A queuing system may be in place outside the Halls while sessions change over. Please follow instructions given by staff – you'll enter the venue at the earliest possible time to enjoy your session.
- Please follow directions to reach the seating area that corresponds to the **block number** on your ticket.
- Prams and pushchairs must be admitted to the **dedicated storage area in the right-hand corner of the Hall** before you enter the seating area.
- Toilets are available within the Hall for the use of Netball spectators.
- A pass-out/re-entry system will be in place for spectators wishing to access the toilets or food & drink kiosks on the main Plaza.

SECC Boxing Hall

- The Boxing Hall can be accessed via doors 4 and 5 on the right-hand side of the concourse.
- A queuing system may be in place outside the Halls while sessions change over. Please follow instructions given by staff – you'll enter the venue at the earliest possible time to enjoy your session.
- Please follow directions to reach the seating area that corresponds to the **block number** on your ticket.
- Prams and pushchairs must be admitted to the **dedicated storage area in the right-hand corner of the Hall** before you enter the seating area.
- Toilets and food & drink kiosks are available within the Hall for the use of Boxing spectators. A pass-out/re-entry system may be in place for spectators wishing to access additional facilities in the Quay West Courtyard opposite the Hall, but exit onto/re-entry from the main Plaza will not be permitted.

SECC Judo/Wrestling Hall

- The Judo/Wrestling Hall can be accessed via doors 6 and 7 on the right-hand side of the concourse.
- A queuing system may be in place outside the Halls while sessions change over. Please follow instructions given by staff – you'll enter the venue at the earliest possible time to enjoy your session.
- Please follow directions to reach the seating area that corresponds to the **block number** on your ticket.
- Prams and pushchairs must be admitted to the **dedicated storage area in the right-hand corner of the Hall** before you enter the seating area.
- Toilets and food & drink kiosks are available within the Hall for the use of Wrestling and Judo spectators. A pass-out/re-entry system may be in place for spectators wishing to access additional facilities in the Quay West Courtyard opposite the Hall, but exit onto/re-entry from the main Plaza will not be permitted.

Travelling to the SECC Precinct

Approximately 1.7 miles (35 minutes' walk) from George Square (Glasgow city centre)

Glasgow 2014 is a public transport Games. Where possible, cycle or walk. Plan your Games Time journeys using the Traveline Scotland Journey Planning App: travelinescotland.com


- Limited parking for wheelchair users/Blue Badge holders is located at the multi-storey car park on Stobcross Road, 5 minutes' walk from venue. It's free and must be pre-booked on a first-come, first-served basis at glasgow2014.com/accessibility
- Accessible Shuttle services for those with restricted mobility are detailed on the following page, and must also be pre-booked at glasgow2014.com/accessibility

No Accessible Shuttle service will be provided from Exhibition Centre Station. | Many normal services will be running, but may be adjusted for Games Time. For further information go to travelinescotland.com | Partick Station is served by trains from Glasgow Central and Queen Street stations. Accessible Shuttle places are available to wheelchair users/easy access ticket holders on a first-come, first-served basis and must be pre-booked at glasgow2014.com/accessibility | Glasgow Subway is not considered accessible to all due to the number of steps in its stations. 

Near the SECC Precinct

- **Glasgow Science Centre**
This family attraction has lots of activities to keep visitors of all ages entertained for hours. It packs two acres full of interactive exhibits, workshops, shows, activities and an IMAX cinema. Well worth a fun, educational visit.
- **Riverside Museum and The Tall Ship**
One of the finest transport collections in the world is housed in the architecturally acclaimed museum, which was voted European museum of the year in 2013. The Tall Ship, the Glenlee, docks here – it's one of only five Clyde-built tall ships still afloat in the world.
- **The Titan Crane**
The Titan is a century old crane which has been transformed into a tourist attraction housing a collection of artefacts. Travel back in time to Clydebanks' shipbuilding era and admire magnificent views across the Clyde from this 150ft high viewpoint.
- **BBC at the Quay**
Don't miss the BBC's 16 day festival which will take place outside BBC Scotland's headquarters at Pacific Quay. It will showcase BBC events plus live music every night, comedy, sport, live radio and TV on a giant screen.
- **Sound to Sea (Cryptic), Glasgow Science Centre, 1-2 August 2014 22.00-23.30**
A nighttime nautical outdoor extravaganza with live music, aerial dance, fireworks, boats and spectacular visuals at the Canting Basin of the River Clyde. Sound to Sea features some of Scotland's best loved musical talent.
- **'Cargo, Camera, Action!' (Glasgow Film), Custom House Quay, 26 July 2014**
Spend the day at an outdoor cinematic spectacular which will take over part of the River Clyde for a celebration of Glasgow and film. Highlights include theatrical concerts and a mocked-up film set from arts collective 85A.
